The Collaborative Applicant (CA), Miriam's House (MH), employs a Homeless System Coordinator to fulfill the responsibilities of the CA. This project covers the partial salary of the Homeless System Coordinator (job description attached) responsible for the day to day operations of the CoC, administering the CoC's HMIS, and planning for the CoC. The CA provides support to the CoC Board and committees in system and project performance evaluation, using data to inform CoC decisions, setting priorities and benchmarks and monitoring the CVCoC Strategic Plan to End Homelessness. The CA provides oversight to the CoC's coordinated entry process to ensure compliance with HUD guidance. The CA oversees the revision of the CoC's Policies & Procedures to include specific policies on board selection, the system serving those fleeing domestic violence, written standards for project admission and assistance. HMIS privacy and security and a Data Quality Plan and submits all documents to the CoC Board for approval. The CA planning responsibilities include holding membership meetings each quarter, recruiting new members quarterly, and working with the membership to coordinate and implement a housing and service system to meet the needs of the homeless population and subpopulations within the Lynchburg CoC. The CA coordinates various funding streams such as ESG and CoC funds and ensures compliance with the interim rule and the most recent NOFO. Other planning duties include conducting a twice a year point-in-time count of homeless persons within the geographic area, conducting an annual gaps analysis of the homeless needs and services available, providing information to complete the Consolidated Plan(s) within the geographic area, and consulting with state and local government ESG program recipients within the CoC on the plan for allocating ESG program funds and reporting on and evaluating the performance of ESG program recipients and subrecipients. The CA, with Board approval, has established a collaborative and objective process for determining the allocation of state and federal homeless response grant funds. The CA oversees the CoC's VAWA emergency transfer plan to ensure safety and compliance.

2. Describe the estimated schedule for the proposed activities, the management plan, and the method for assuring effective and timely completion of all work.

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Miriam's House has been the Collaborative Applicant (CA) for the Lynchburg CoC since July 1, 2017. The planning functions of MH have been underway since that time and there will be no lag in continuing to perform the activities outlined in this grant application. The staff working to fulfill the requirements of a Collaborative Applicant include a Homeless System Coordinator, the Director of Housing Services and the Executive Director. All staff are in place and have extensive experience in fulfilling the planning activities of the CoC. The Homeless System Coordinator and Director of Housing Services are supervised by the Executive Director. The Executive Director has a Masters in Social Work and 12 years of homeless response experience. The Director of Housing Services also possesses a Masters in Social Work with 9 years of homeless response experience. The Homeless System Coordinator has 6 years of project management experience providing technical support and project planning at an organizational level. These 3 staff members have weekly planning meetings and monthly meetings with the CoC board to coordinate and carry out CA responsibilities. Infrastructure to support the CoC planning functions of MH have already been established through the CoC Policies and Procedures which include the written standards. Additionally the CoC participated in a strategic planning process in 2020 which updated the CoC plan to end homelessness along with goals and benchmarks for system performance. The Policies and Procedures and the Strategic Plan to End Homelessness guide the work of the CA, the CoC membership, and CoC Board. Miriam's House has managed the HMIS Lead role for the past 13 years and established and led the CoC in 1996. MH, as the Collaborative Applicant, is responsible to the CoC Board to fulfill the functions as outlined in 24 CFR 578 and the CoC Policies and Procedures. The CoC Board conducted a monitoring and evaluation of MH's performance in serving as the Collaborative Applicant during FY20. The report was favorable and the CoC Board has selected MH to remain the Collaborative Applicant for FY21.

3. How will the requested funds improve or maintain the CoC's ability to evaluate the outcome of CoC and ESG projects?

These funds enable the Collaborative Applicant (CA) to employ a Homeless System Coordinator which increases the Lynchburg CoC's capacity to monitor and evaluate CoC and ESG projects. As CA, Miriam's House has developed monitoring tools based on all applicable grant and statutory regulations as well as local priorities and written standards. The Homeless System Coordinator provides support to the Monitoring and Evaluation Committee of the CoC to complete annual CoC and ESG project audits which include evaluations of data quality, outcomes, project standards, and financial practices. The Homeless System Coordinator reports CoC and ESG project audit outcomes to the CoC Board which inform renewal, reallocation and reduction decisions. Data is regularly pulled on project-level performance to determine the need for technical assistance or additional training. The Homeless System Coordinator works with the CoC Board to evaluate system performance consistent with standards outlined in the CoC Policies and Procedures.

This will advise that the Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation administers an endowment fund, established January 1, 1998, specifically designated for Miriam's House. According to the original Declaration of Trust, "it is intended that the income be used and applied by the Trustees in a manner so as to assist in defraying the costs of staffing, operating and maintaining the Housing Facility, or otherwise meeting the needs of the Grantor Purpose." As of December 31, 2021, the market value of the Miriam's House Endowment Fund was \$2,223,428.37.

The Board of Directors of the Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation has a current policy of paying out 5% of the market value of its endowment funds, based on a twelve-quarter rolling average. The Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation ensures a \$91,683.00 match in 2022 under the provisions of the Miriam's House Endowed Trust.
